Career Specialist well continue to attend IPS training in order to begin helping members find employment through the IPS program. Career Specialists will attend all ISP trainings and will word closely with Sharon Cook from DHS on any available training.

Promote the Wasatch House4 employment program in the community by presenting our employment programs to businesses and identify local businesses that would want to partner with Wasatch House and provide employment opportunities WE will reach out to our Advisory Board to see if there are any possible contacts. We will identify three jobs in the community for our members.
